

COMMUNITY OUTCOMES REPORT - FISCAL YEAR 2016


Over 15,000 individuals experience homelessness each year in Orange County.

On one given night, over 2,200 people were counted on the streets of Orange County (2015 Point-in-Time).

And 1,300 school-aged children are living in motels or are literally unsheltered (O.C.D.E. 2015).

Success Story

The Ramirez Family came to Theriault House after having been turned away from so many other options. As a family of 7, Mom, Dad and 5 children ranging in ages from 8 months-10 years old who had been living homeless in Garden Grove, no one would take them in, except the Illumination Foundation at this newly developed Theriault House in partnership with HomeAid OC. The family finally found a safe place to land and rest. The children are now attending school consistently, while Mom and Dad are taking care of everyday needs to continue progressing. They have been on a fixed income of cash aid for quite some time and the program and partnership with their assigned Case Manager has allowed the parents to understand and engage in workforce programs and other supportive services. 48 days later, they received notice of their approved status through another Homeless Service Provider for rapid re-housing.

HomeAid Essentials collected and distributed over 1.3 million essential items for homeless babies throughout Orange County

6,000 Hygiene and CareKits assembled and distributed throughout the year

During the month of November, for Homelessness Awareness Month, 200+ Volunteers engaged in service activities and community collections of blankets, socks, and hygiene items valued at over \$25,000

Participated in Orange County's Inaugural National Homeless Person's Memorial Day in remembrance of the many homeless men and women who die on the streets during the year
